

MBT Chapter Thirty Four Outline

1. Election Defined

A number of expressions are related to the concept of election. A synonym for the word "election" is the word "chosen." It is applied to Israel, to the church, and also to the apostles. Other words are also used such as foreordination and predestination. meaning behind all of the words is to determine beforehand, or to ordain beforehand. Also, there is frequent reference to this concept in the Bible, where the word "determine" is used. The thought in all of these terms is that God's choice precedes the act and is determined by His sovereign will.

Still another term used is the word call. In John Jesus referred to this calling as a drawing of men to God.

Systems of human thought have tended to go either to one extreme where God's sovereign purpose is made absolute or to another extreme of magnifying the freedom of man until God is no longer in control. In attempting to resolve such a difficult problem, the only solution is to appeal to divine revelation and attempt interpret human experience on the basis of what the Bible teaches.

In Scripture, God's sovereign purpose extends to individuals as well as to nations. Israel is referred to an elect nation (Isa. 45:4; 65:9, 22

The term "elect" is frequently applied to individuals who are chosen to salvation. The term "elect is also used of Christ. The fact of election is also mentioned in a number of scriptures. The thought in election is that the one or group mentioned is chosen for a divine purpose, usually related to salvation.

2. Fact of Election

Although the doctrine of election is beyond human comprehension, it is clearly a doctrine of Scripture. By divine election God has chosen certain individuals to salvation and predestined them to be conformed to the character of His Son Jesus Christ. It is clear that the choice originates in God and that this choice is part of God's eternal plan.

Divine election is not an act of God in time, but rather a part of His eternal purpose. Because God's plan is eternal, election as an essential part of it must also be eternal.



One of the knotty problems in the doctrine of election is the relationship of election to foreknowledge. One form of interpretation which tends to soften the concept of election builds on the idea that God foreknew those who would receive Christ, and on the basis of this foreknowledge elected them to salvation. This concept, however, has inherent problems as it seems to make God subject to a plan in which He is not sovereign.

Election and foreknowledge work together. God foreknew that no man in his free will would accept Christ so because of His love he elected some to be saved by drawing his free will to faith.



3. **Defense** of the Doctrine of Election

Although some theologians have attempted to explain away the doctrine of election and to resolve the problem, in effect, by denying what the Scriptures teach, the arguments against divine election are usually based upon misunderstandings:

1. Election is represented as asserting that God is arbitrary. This, of course, arises from unbelief. God is sovereign, but His sovereignty is always wise, holy, good and loving.



- 2. **Another objection** is often raised that this makes God unjust, as some are not included in His purpose of salvation. Here it should be observed that God is not obligated to save any and those whom He does save of their free will believe. No one is saved against his will, and no one disbelieves against his will. God draws the will to faith in Christ
- 3.A very common objection to this doctrine is that it discourages missionary effort to bring the Gospel to the lost and discourages those who desire to be saved. The answer, of course, is that God has included in His plan that the Gospel should be preached to every creature, and God desires the salvation of all



4. Still another objection is that if we are elected to salvation then the none elect are hopeless. Scripture clearly emphasizes that some are elected to salvation, and the unsaved are destined for their lot, not because men who desired salvation were unable to secure it, but always on the ground that those who are unsaved chose to be unsaved.

Charles Spurgeon was once asked who are the elect? His response was "those who will believe"


Keith Drury Associate Professor of Religion at Indiana Wesleyan University writes this...



"Arminianism has triumphed. (Over Calvinism) This great theological battle was won without warfare, with few debates, without "dueling magazine articles." How ironic that in a day when theology no longer matters to most people, one of the great theological battles of all times seems to have been settled.

Droves of Calvinists have become Arminians—at least in practice. **They have not become convinced the Bible really teaches the Arminian approach.** Frankly, Arminianism is simply more palatable to a secular culture. It "fits in" to the mind-set of the people in their pews. Like it or not, the secular mind is naturally Arminian in its outlook."

Keith Drury writes:

"If you are recently coming from the Calvinistic end, be careful not to pass right by the middle ground and run off to extreme Arminianism: mancentered humanism. Instead, if you stay on the Arminian side, but at the end **near the Calvinist line**, you'll be safe in these waters. If you want a name for that area—the area on the Arminian end, but just "a hair's breadth from Calvinism," some call this the "Wesleyan-Arminian" approach."

5 points of Arminianism

(4) Resistible Grace –

(5) Conditional Salvation –

(1) Partial Depravity – Humanity is depraved but still able to seek God.

(2) Conditional Election – God only "chooses" those whom He knows will choose to believe.

(3) Unlimited Atonement – Jesus died for everyone, even those who are not chosen and will not believe.

God's call to be saved can be resisted and/or rejected

Christians can lose their salvation if they actively reject the Holy Spirit's influence in their lives.

(4 point) Calvinism

(1) Total Depravity –

Man is totally depraved, spiritually dead and blind, and unable to repent.

(2) Unconditional Election –

His election is God's own decision, and is not based on the foreseen response of anyone's faith and repentance.

(3) Unlimited Atonement –

When Christ died on the cross, He shed His blood for everyone


(4) Irresistible Grace -

The internal call by God's grace cannot be resisted and always results in conversion

(5) Perseverance of the Saints –

God preserves the elect so they persevere to the end, so no chosen person will be lost A Calvinist Perspective on the Balance...

Advanced Determination



"If you are recently coming from the Arminian end, be careful not to pass right by the middle ground and run off to hyper Calvinism: a sovereign God and an inactive man. Instead, if you stay on the Calvinist side, but at the end near the Arminian line, you'll be safe in these waters. If you want a name for that area—the area on the Calvinist end, but just "a hair's breadth from Aminianism," some call this the "Calvinist approach" with a balanced understanding of foreknowledge and advanced determination.

Foreknowledge is the first step in the logical order of God's Divine Decrees...

Donald Grey Barnhouse's definition of Foreknowledge:

God's foreknowledge is an advanced determination to carry through a plan which He has eternally purposed in the counsels of His owns will, and which is to be carried though without variation because the Lord brings to pass all that He has thus determined and decreed. God's foreknowledge is not advance knowledge of something which I have chosen to do but God's foreknowledge is God bringing to pass in me something which He has planned for me.

In considering the problem of divine election as related to human choices and moral responsibility on the part of man, the answer seems to be that in choosing a plan God chose the plan as a whole. He knew in advance, before the choice of a plan, who in this plan would be saved and who would not be saved. By faith we must assume that God chose the best possible plan. The plan included giving man some freedom of choice for which he would be held responsible. The fact that God knew under each plan what each man would do does not mean that God forced man to do something against his will and then punish him for it.
