



**Chapter Thirty- Two: Assurance of Salvation** 

A. Importance of Assurance

In Christian experience, assurance that one is saved by faith in Christ is essential to the whole program of growth in grace and in the knowledge of Christ. Assurance is a matter of experience and relates to personal confidence in present salvation. It should not be confused with the doctrine of eternal security, which will be discussed in the next chapter. Eternal security is a question of fact, while assurance is a matter of what one believes at a given time concerning his personal salvation.



B. **Understanding** the Nature of Salvation

Essential to any real assurance of salvation is a clear understanding of what was accomplished by Jesus Christ in His death on the cross. Salvation is not a work of man for God, but a work of God for man; it depends completely upon divine grace without respect to human merit. One who understands that Jesus Christ died for him and provided a complete salvation which is offered to anyone who sincerely believes in Christ can, accordingly, have assurance of his salvation just as soon as he meets the condition of trusting in Christ as his Savior.

Once understanding salvation, the question resolves itself into the issue of whether one has really trusted in Christ. This question can be answered by the confirmations that are found in Christian experience of a person who has received salvation.

Understand Among the accomplishments of salvation of the new birth is given the supreme emphasis in assurance. Eighty-five New Testament passages attest this feature of saving grace. Consideration of these passages discloses the fact that this imparted life is the gift of God to all those who believe on Christ it is from Christ it is Christ indwelling the believer in the sense that eternal life is inseparable from Him and therefore is as eternal as He is eternal.

C. Confirming Testimony of the Christian Experience



On the basis of the fact that Christ indwells him, the believer is appointed to judge himself as to whether he is in the faith; for it is reasonable to expect that the heart wherein Christ dwells will, under normal conditions, be aware of that wonderful presence. However, the Christian is not left to his own understanding as to the precise manner in which the indwelling Christ will be manifested, as it is clearly defined in Scripture. This revelation serves a twofold purpose: it protects against the assumption that fleshly emotionalism is proof of Assurance and it sets a standard of spiritual reality on which the believer can rest for his Assurance.



The unsaved will never manifest the life which is Christ, and in like manner, the carnal Christian will never manifest the life which is Christ and he can in no way with accuracy prove his salvation by his experience.

A carnal Christian is as perfectly saved as the spiritual Chris tian; for no experience or merit or service can form any part of the grounds of salvation. Though carnal, he is, nevertheless, in Christ. His obligation toward God is not to exercise saving faith, but rather to adjust to the mind and will of God. Confident assurance only comes to those who are Spirit-filled, those who are walking in the Spirit. It is the Spirit that bears witness with our spirit that we are the sons of God.

#### 1. The knowledge that God is our Heavenly Father

A normal Christian experience includes, therefore, a personal appreciation of the fatherhood of God and gives Assurance

### 2. A new reality in prayer is another confirming experience which leads to assurance.

Prayer assumes a very large place in the experience of the spiritual Christian. It becomes increasingly his most vital resource. It is a manifestation of the indwelling Spirit. By the indwelling Spirit the believer offers praise and thanksgiving and by the Spirit he is enabled to pray according to the will of God

### 3. A new ability to understand Scripture is another important experience related to salvation.

According to the promise of Christ, the child of God will understand through the Spirit the things of Christ, the things of the Father, and things to come On the Emmaus road Christ opened Scripture to His hearers and opened their hearts to Scripture as well. Such an experience, though so wonderful, is not designed alone for favored Christians; it is the normal experience of all who are right with God, since it is a natural manifestation of the indwelling Christ and brings assurance.

### 4. A new sense of the sinfulness of sin is the normal experience of one who is saved

As water removes that which is foreign and unclean, so the Word of God condemns that which is unclean and implants those ideals which are of God. Through the Word a divine estimate of sin displaces the human estimate. It is impossible that the sinless Christ, who sweat drops of blood on becoming a sin offering, should not, when free to manifest His presence, create a new sense of the corrupting nature of sin in the one in whom He dwells.

5. A new love is experienced also for the saved.

In 1 John 3:14, love for the brethren is made an absolute test of personal salvation.. The fact that the same divine presence indwells two individuals relates them vitally and anticipates a corresponding bond of devotion. The Christian's love one for the other is therefore made a sign of true discipleship and constitutes a basis of assurance.

6. A supreme basis for assurance is the manifestation of the character of Christ in the believer.

The divine presence of Christ in the heart are indicated by the words: "Love, joy, peace, long suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith; meekness, temperance". Each of these words represent character of God and the life which Christ lived, it is the life which is Christlike, and it is the life which is Christ. Since these graces are wrought by the Spirit who indwells every believer, this experience is provided for all.

#### 7. A new love is realized for the unsaved.

Apart from all earthly distinctions, men were seen by Paul's spiritual eyes only as souls for whom Christ had died. Likewise, for the lost Paul ceased not to pray and to strive and he so loved the lost that he was willing to be "accursed from Christ" for their salvation. This divine compassion should be experienced by every Spirit-filled believer and is an evidence of their salvation.



## 8. The combined experiences of the Christian life bring a consciousness of salvation and assurance

Saving faith in Christ is a definite experience. The Apostle Paul related of himself, "I know whom I have believed". A personal reliance upon a Savior is so definite an act of the will and attitude of the mind that one could hardly be deceived regarding it. But it is the purpose of God that the normal Christian be assured in his own heart that he is accepted of God.

Understand

To the spiritual Christian, the Spirit bears witness that he is a son of God. Similarly, having trusted in Christ, the believer will have no more the consciousness of condemnation be cause of sin This does not imply that the Christian will not be conscious of the sin which he commits; it rather has to do with a consciousness of an eternal acceptance with God through Christ), which is the portion of all who believe.

# 1. Confidence that the Bible is true and that its promises of salvation will be certainly fulfilled is essential to assurance of salvation.

Above and beyond all that the believer may experience - which experience is too often indefinite because of carnality - there is given the abiding evidence of the dependable Word of God.

In addressing believers the Apostle John states, "These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may know that ye have eternal life" By this passage assurance is given to every believer, carnal and spiritual alike, that they may know they have eternal life. This assurance is made to rest, not on a changeable experience, but upon the things which are written in the un changeable Word of God

Understand

The written promises of God are like a title deed thus inspire confidence. These promises of salvation form the unconditional covenant of God under grace and call for no human merit, nor are they proven to be true through any human experience. These mighty realities are to be reckoned as accomplished on no other ground than the veracity of God.

2. Doubting whether one has really committed himself to faith in Christ and the promises of God is destructive to the Christian faith

Multitudes are in no way certain that they ever have had a personal transaction with Christ regarding their own salvation. While it is nonessential that one should know the day and the hour of his decision, it is imperative that he know that he is now trusting Christ without reference to the time it began. Without assurance there can be no growth in Christ.

3. Doubting the faithfulness of God is also fatal to any true experience of assurance.

Some lack assurance of their own salvation because they are not sure that God has actually received them and saved them. This state of mind is usually caused by looking for a change in their feelings rather than looking to the faithfulness of Christ. Feelings and experiences have their place; but, as stated before, the final evidence of personal salvation, which is unchanged by these, is the truthfulness of God. What He has said, He will do, and it is not pious or commend able for a person to distrust his salvation after having definitely cast himself upon Christ.

4. Assurance of salvation, accordingly, depends upon under standing the nature of God's complete salvation.


Confirmation may be found in part in Christian experience, and normally there is some change in life on the part of a person who has trusted Christ as his Savior. It is most essential that he realize that assurance of salvation depends upon the certainty of the promises of God and the certainty that the individual has committed himself by faith to Jesus Christ in keeping with these promises. One who has made this commitment can rely upon the faithfulness of God, who cannot lie to keep His promises and to save the believer by divine power and grace.





Php 2:5 Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:

#### 7. A new love is realized for the unsaved.

Christ has died for all men therefore we should give our lives for souls

2Co 5:14-15 For the love of Christ constrains us; because we thus judge, that if **one died for all,** then were all dead: And that he died for all, that they which live **should not henceforth live unto themselves**, but unto him which died for them, and rose again.

Men are seen only as souls for whom Christ had died.

2 Cor. 5:16 Henceforth know we no man after the flesh

Paul's prayer was for the lost

Rom 10:1 Brethren, my heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is, that they might be saved.

Paul worked for the salvation of the lost

Rom 15:20 Yea, so have I strived to preach the gospel,

Paul so loved the lost he was willing to be "accursed from Christ" (Rom. 9:1-3).

Compassion for the lost should be experienced by every Spirit-filled believer

Rom 5:5-5 And hope maketh not ashamed; because **the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts** by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us. For when we were yet without strength, in due time **Christ died for the ungodly**.

8. The combined experiences of the Christian life bring a consciousness of salvation and assurance

Saving faith in Christ is a definite experience. **2 Tim. 1:12** *I know whom I have believed* 

Spirit bears witness that he is a son of God (Rom. 8:16).

Rom 8:16 The Spirit itself bears witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God:

Believer has no more the consciousness of condemnation be cause of sin

Rom 8:1 There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus

**Heb 9:14** How much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without spot to God, **purge your conscience** from dead works to serve the living God?
